REPORT CARD GRADES



Reviewing the Archdiocese of Cincinnati report card, you may feel a slight confusion. The report card emphasizes student growth, especially with skills. It is a standards=based report card that contains numeric numbers-1, 2,3, 4-instead of showing alphabetical letters-A,B,C,D,F-.There also is a N/A or "Not assessed this Grading Period" score in order that you may have a general ideal of what subjects or lessons your child received during the quarter. The Archdiocesan graded course of Study (GCS) shows "skill standards of what all students are expected to know and be able to do by the time they leave their current grade. According to the Archdiocese "All Catholic elementary schools are expected to use the grading system." Last year St. Benedict the Moor began to use the standard-based report card.
