The Advent wreath is a circular garland of evergreen branches representing eternity. Four candles represent the weeks of Advent. Advent is the season or period of time in which Christians prepare for the coming of Jesus which is celebrated at Christmas. The word "advent" means coming.

In every classroom there is a display of the Advent wreath. Catholic tradition displays the advent wreath as a symbolism of the coming of the Lord, Jesus Christ. It represents an aspect of the spiritual preparation. Celebrating with an Advent wreath during the weeks prior to Christmas is a great way for Christians to keep Christ at the center of Christmas.

Christmas on Campus at U.D.

Grades 1 and 2 will experience "Christmas on Campus" on December 7th. from 4:00—8:00 PM.

"Christmas on Campus" will be celebrating the 55th year on the University of Dayton campus. It is a hallmark event symbolizing the Catholic and Marianist tradition of celebrating Christmas and the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, which is on December 8, dates back to 1964 when a group of students gathered and decided they wanted to celebrate Christmas before they left for the holidays.
