Station 5. Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus **Station 12:** Jesus dies on the cross.

Station 6: Veronica wipes Jesus' face. **Station 13**:Jesus' body is taken down from the cross.

Station 7: Jesus falls a second time Station 14:Jesus is laid in the tomb
