STANDARD BASED REPORT CARDS

Time is steadily flying as the end of the first quarter approaches. Many public and private schools are converting to the Standards Based Report Card (SBRC). What students should know and be able to do at each grade level by the end of the school year. Instead of using the traditional scores of "A, B, C's etc." for mathematics, language arts, science, social studies, and religion (Catholic schools) grades will contain more accurate information of Student Progress Updates quarterly.

The difference of SBRC or Student Progress reports from traditional report cards is that students receive separate marks for each subject taught by his/her teacher instead of one grade. You will see numbers 4,3,2,1 or N/A (not assessed or taught doing the particular quarter), Quarter 1 will end October 19.

If the student receives a 4 then the student "independently uses and demonstrates higher level thinking skills. Few students perform at this level."

- dent demonstrates understanding. This indicates achievement at grade level.
- Student earning a 2 has not yet met the standards but is progressing toward achieving skills. It indicates ongoing growth.
- Student earning a 1 is currently not meeting the grade level standards. Intervention is needed from teacher, tutors, and parents/guardians.

N/A –Not Assessed or taught at the quarter .

Specific academic skills and knowledge allows the parent/guardian to review specific areas where help or additional instruction is required.
