HelpNow is an online academic support service from Brainfuse, available 24/7 at the Dayton Metro Library website. It features an extensive library of lessons, video tutorials and practice tests, as well as live, on-demand, one-on-one tutoring.

Learners of any age have access to an extensive library of lessons, video tutorials, and practice tests that are available 24/7 from HelpNow. Live tutoring assistance can be accessed by clicking the "Get Live Help" button during tutoring hours, 2-11 PM seven days a week. HelpNow provides unique services for each of the three main sources of learning-expert instruction, peer-to-peer collaboration, and independent study in these general subject areas: Math, Science, Social Studies, English/Language Arts, Reading Comprehension, and Spanish Language.
