Early Registration

Open House was scheduled on Monday, January 13. Be aware if current students enroll for the next school year some classes may become full. To ensure your child a space for 2020-2021 school year and to spend less on registration it's better to register early. Early registration fee is \$50.00 for individuals and \$75.00 for 2 or more children. After a certain date — either in March or April-the fee will increase by \$25.00 for families-\$75.00 for individuals and \$100.00 for 2 or more . EdChoice Scholarships are being accepted , but you must be registered in order to obtain the tuition assistance, and live in a Dayton Public School district.




Next school year-2020-2021- grade 8 will be added to the student enrollment at St. Benedict the Moor Catholic School. In 2014-2015 the last grade 8 class graduated; in addition, students promoted to grades 4—8 were transferred to other elementary schools. By formatting the name St. Benedict the Moor Catholic School (formerly Mary Queen of Peace Catholic School) In August 17, 2015 the enrollment of students only consisted of Pre-K thru Grade 3 students.

Since the transition the school has added a higher level grade each school year. The current grade 7 students will go down in history as being the first class to graduate from St. Benedict the Moor Catholic School in 2021.
