On Monday, November 2, 2020 students voices were echoing "hello". It had been nearly 7 months since hearing the sounds of a school environment in the hallways. Teachers still observing students online and now in the classroom, which is challenging because of uncontrollable technological difficulties. There are underground street maintenance projects in the neighborhood that sporadically interrupt the Internet service.

Directional 'One Way' signs are taped along the stainway walls. All students and staff are required to wear mask except when eating or drinking. Currently, there are 179 students attending St. Benedict the Moor School; however, about 30-35 students are virtual learners. More restrictions are given to visitors, which helps to prevent the spread of Covid-19 and provide more security. Hand sanitation and temperature checks are additional requirements to enter inside the school.
