

Students Receiving the Sacraments of Initiation

What are sacraments? Sacraments are religious ceremonies or signs of faith that teach and strengthen a person. In the Catholic religion there are seven sacraments that are divided into three groups. First group consists of the Sacraments of Initiation -Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation in which a person becomes a full member of the Christian

community. On Easter Sunday (April 17) several of the students will be Baptized at St. Benedict the Moor Catholic Church. They are Landrine Zabayo (4), Evelyne Iraguha (4) and Sydney Rockhold-Layne (4). On the following Sunday (April 24) the following students will receive their First Communion or Eucharist:Prisca Ushindi (3), Sydney Rockhold-Layne(4), Vanessa Irakoze (6), Evelyne Iraguha (4), Landrine Zabayo (4) and Irene Izere (7). Confirmation will be in May with Vanessa Irakoze and Irene Izere. Hopefully you'll be able to come to a service at St. Benedict in order to witness the sacramental rituals. The other two categories of the sacraments are Sacraments of Healing (Reconciliation or Confession and Anointing of the Sick) and Sacraments of Commitment (Matrimony [Marriage] and Holy Orders [priest and deacons]. All seven sacraments were instituted by Jesus Christ.

For the 2024 eclipse, complete darkness will descend midafternoon.

Viewers should be prepared for unusual events like noticeable temperature drops and unexpected animal behavior. Bats may emerge, spiders break down their webs or animals stop daytime activities to return to resting places.

Many Ohioans have viewed partial eclipses, but a truly unique experience occurs within totality zones. All or parts of 55 Ohio counties will experience totality. The remaining 33 counties will have a partial eclipse. Millions of tourists are expected to descend on the state with a likely side effect being serious traffic congestion and supply shortages. Mark the date and begin planning now for opportunities to participate in this historic event. Maps of the eclipse path with event locations, general eclipse information and safety considerations can be found at eclipse.ohio.gov.
