### Students Improved on Their i-Ready Test Assessments

During the school year it is mandatory for students to take state assessments. The Archdiocese of Cincinnati requires students to take iReady–Math and Reading Assessments -three times per school year. Students begin testing when they return from summer vacation; this is usually in August/September. The Winter tests begin after holiday break in January Here is a comparison of student diagnostics for Fall and Winter. Hopefully by iReady 3 the lower scores will become higher for improvement.
